EARLY CHILDHOOD EDUCATOR

The early childcare centre of the Regroupement des centres d'amitié autochtones du Québec (RCAAQ) is an organization related to the RCAAQ. It fulfills the educational, social, community and cultural mission of Indigenous families in urban areas. The RCAAQ childcare centre serves as a cultural anchor for Indigenous families where pride in identity is strengthened, while ensuring the operationalization of its goals and the development of future facilities.

MISSION

The childcare centre welcomes and supports children in all aspects of their development, from building their confidence and pride in their Indigenous identity to their overall wellness (mino pimatisiwin), in collaboration with families and the urban Indigenous community.

RESPONSIBILITIES

Under the supervision of the childcare centre's management staff, early childhood educators foster child development by creating a safe, stimulating environment aligned with the kids' cultural background. Through their daily interactions, they support children in developing skills, independence and self-confidence. By valuing Indigenous cultures and knowledge, educators help strengthen children's sense of belonging and identity, working closely with families and the community.

TASKS

More specifically, early childhood educators must :

- Ensure the health, safety and well-being of children
- Plan, prepare and implement educational programs that promote children's holistic development
- Organize and meaningfully integrate Indigenous cultural activities that celebrate First Nation languages, knowledge, traditions, stories and identities, in collaboration with families, Elders and the urban community
- Observe and support children in the four developmental areas
- Plan and lead educational and creative activities
- Maintain a safe and healthy environment
- Assess children's abilities and needs, and maintain open communication with parents
- Identify learning difficulties and document observations
- Support children in developing healthy habits
- Collaborate with families and partners
- Supervise the early childhood educator assistant as needed
